

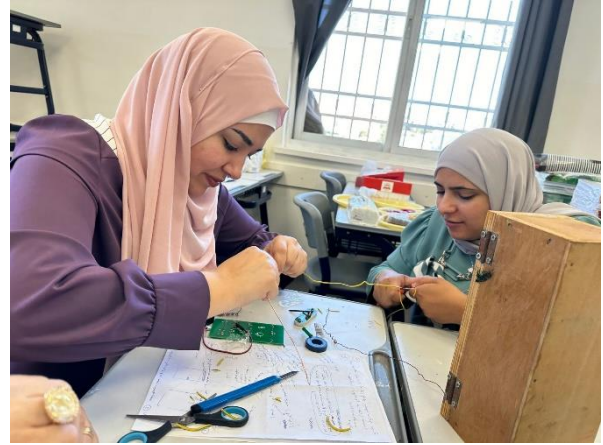

FHF concludes a training workshops entitled Project-Based Learning (PBL)

On Thursday the fifth of September 2024, the Faisal Hussein Foundation concluded its workshops for science teachers on Project-Based Learning (PBL).

The workshops aimed to introduce teachers to the concept of project-based learning as an educational strategy and how to apply it in the classroom to enhance students' engagement and enable them to practically explore scientific concepts. The focus was also on distinguishing this strategy from implementing projects as separate learning activities, as project-based learning represents a comprehensive approach that requires planning and execution over a period of time to achieve multiple educational goals.





During the workshops, teachers were introduced to the necessary skills to design effective educational projects linked to real life. The emphasis was on the core components of project-based learning, which include: a driving question or real-world problem, where the project begins with a problem or a question that students need to solve; then they move to the research and discovery phase, where students explore ideas and implement solutions. After that comes the production and application phase, where an actual project is carried out, often yielding tangible results. Finally, assessment and review are conducted, including continuous evaluation by both students and teachers to ensure the educational objectives are met.

The workshops offered teachers a practical opportunity to apply these core components in an interactive learning environment, where they designed educational projects that simulate real-life challenges their students may face in their classrooms. This will contribute to enabling teachers to use project-based learning as a tool to stimulate students' critical and creative thinking.

The PBL workshops were conducted by Mrs. Dima Halawani, as part of the Faisal Hussein Foundation's project with the title: Upgrading the Quality of Education in Jerusalem, funded by the Arab Fund for Economic & Social Development.
